

"My aim was to design a space that was multifunctional and easy to navigate," says architect Jean-Henri Morin of Atelier One. "I wanted it to be simple, open and light."

One, the budget dictated
the structural aspects of the
design. "More money would
enable greater changes, but to keep costs
down I avoided touching the walls and
window," explains Jean-Henri. However,
he would have to make some minor structural changes in closing up the doorway
into the hall and removing the fireplace to
create access from the master bedroom.

LAYOUT

The challenge then was to organise the bathing, dressing and grooming functions in an interesting and effective way within the limited space. Keen to avoid cutting the room in half, Jean-Henri decided on an open-plan design with defined spaces.

Central to the design would be a freestanding mirrored wall, which would face the entry, with the toilet and shower positioned behind. While the mirrored wall provides visual separation, the fact that it doesn't reach the ceiling allows for a sense of openness. "The blade wall is a great solution for this space," says Jean-Henri. "Its contemporary, symmetrical design hides the private zones from view."

In front of the mirrored wall would stand a custom-made vanity with a limestone benchtop and two semi-recessed basins. Lights below the benchtop would softly illuminate the teakframed, white Perspex cabinet.

STORAGE

The entire eastern wall would be taken up with wardrobe space, both on either side and above the new doorway. Opaque Perspex sliding screens framed in teak would lend a Japanese sensibility. "The wardrobe is designed as a transition space between the bedroom and the ensuite, while its depth would provide insulation from noise," explains Jean-Henri.

COLOURS AND MATERIALS

The materials were chosen for their earthy tones and easy-care qualities, such as the flooring (off-white and charcoal limestone tiles) and the walls (glossy white tiles with a border of green glass mosaics). "In a small space you need colours which are going to give it personality and a sense of cleanliness," suggests Jean-Henri.

LIGHTING

The layout would allow natural light from the window to filter into the room in the daytime, while at night, eight recessed downlights would provide illumination.
